THE CALL OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Psalms 23, today's responsorial psalm, is arguably the best known of all the psalms. Most of us may not have committed it to memory, but we easily recognize the first sentence:

"The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."

Of the many images that surface in the psalm, there is often one thing that is overlooked; yet, it stares us in the face throughout. For sure, the author of the psalm wants us to realize that the shepherd refers to God. But have you ever noticed how, when and where the pronouns, which refer to God, change? It is very helpful in understanding the fuller significance of the psalm.

In verses 1-3, God is referred to in the third person singular, and the psalmist uses the pronoun 'he' or 'his' when also referring to God. For example, "The Lord is my shepherd...; in verdant pastures he gives me repose...; beside restful waters he leads...; he refreshes...; he guides me...; for his name's sake."

However, in verses 4-5, God is referred to only by the second person singular; 'you' or 'your!' For example, "...I fear no evil, for you are at my side with your rod and your staff...; you spread the table...; you anoint my head with oil..."

Then in verse 6 the psalmist returns to third person singular and refers to God only once in the phrase: "the house of the Lord all the days of my life."

With this in mind, when we re-read the psalm, it is clear that the psalmist genuinely believes that God is always present at every moment; yet, it seems at first as if from a distance especially when things seem to be well: caring for one's wants, giving rest in green pastures near refreshing waters, safe journey on right paths. These are moments when all is well in one's life journey.

Then the psalmist writes of difficulties in that same journey: i.e., walking in the dark valley, having to face evil, the rod and staff protecting one from danger, spreading a table in the sight of one's foes, being anointed with oil; seeing that one's cup overflows in times of drought. It is in those difficult times that the author declares God to be ever close; close enough to have a one-on-one conversation with God: "You, God, are here (next column)

with me! ...watching over me at every moment especially in the sight of my enemies."

Then again, when the danger has passed, the psalmist has God return to the earlier mode of distance (though God never really moves away from us).

God as Shepherd then, must be seen as one who is always beckoning us into a deeper relationship. One who calls each of us by name and desires to be our constant companion in life. This truth most wonderfully shows itself in the person of Jesus Christ - our God walking in our midst and ever-present to us. Indeed, we do have **A Good Shepherd!** *Fr. Geno Doyle*

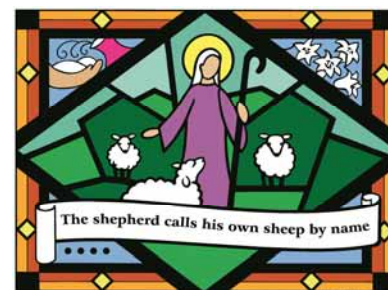

As Parishes Merge...

(This is the third installment of the Town Hall Meeting on January 30, 2011, and a summary of its minutes.)

Next Steps: The two parish pastoral councils meet monthly and have created six (6) special merger committees to capture the issues that need to be addressed so that there might be a blending of ideas as the parishes approach the merger. They are:

1. **Operations** - to examine the day-to-day operations of each parish;
2. **Liturgy** - to examine what is happening in all areas of liturgy;
3. **Faith Formation/Youth Ministry** - will examine and compare the programming in each parish;
4. **Communications** - will focus on how to keep the many issues of the merger before the parishioners in every way possible either by bulletin, parish websites, surveys, special communications and the like;
5. **Finance** - will review current situation and coordinate efforts to have common practices;
6. **Joint Ministries** - review other areas of ministry and coordinate efforts that are common for both parishes.

Each of these merger committees are to examine and make an assessment of where there might be over-lap or duplication in various areas or where there might be need to increase focus. Recommendations will then be made as to how to implement such recommendations as we move forward with the merger.

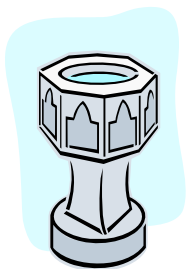
