PETER: Once ROCK - Now SATAN?

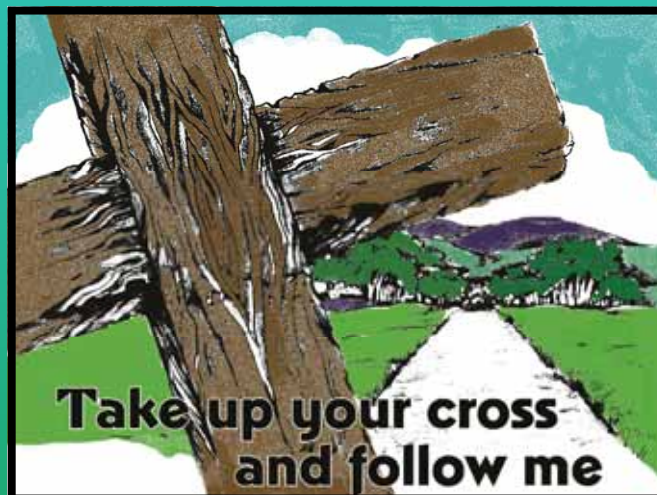
It has been seven days since we heard Jesus declare to Simon Peter: "You are Rock" on which he will build the church. Today's passage (Mt 16:21-27), barely a hundred words later in the same gospel, Jesus has moved from calling Peter 'rock' to calling him "Satan." Does this mean that Jesus is founding the church on the devil? Certainly not! The word literally means 'adversary.' The point Jesus was making - "Don't try to lead me astray from what is being asked of me." Jesus Christ founded the church on human beings, people with frailties and short-comings, like you and me.

In today's gospel Jesus begins to explain his role as Messiah which is significantly different than what most people thought at the time. Jesus and the disciples make their way to Jerusalem, and Jesus tells them that he must be handed over to the elders to suffer, die and rise again. Peter jumps to the wrong conclusion. Peter insists that Messiahs don't talk that way. He thought, as did most people, that the Messiah was coming to throw off the chains of the Roman Empire and make Israel great again.

Peter found it difficult to accept that the mission of Jesus would end with the cross and crucifixion. He did not see why pain and suffering were necessary for discipleship, and was anxious that the Lord avoid this course of action. He failed to grasp the role of suffering in God's plan. He thought being a part of the kingdom meant power and success. He had to learn the teaching of Jesus that does not include prosperity and privilege - a tough message!

This does not mean that we should go looking for crosses; they somehow have the ability to find us easily enough. Rather, as St. Paul urges in Romans that we are to offer ourselves as a living sacrifice. The highest meaning of the word sacrifice is to give of oneself for the good of another. This is what Jesus was trying to tell Peter: "Get back in line with me. Stop looking out only for yourself." We know Peter ultimately sacrificed his very self. What about us? What are you willing to sacrifice for the good of others? There are many opportunities every day.

**As Our Parishes Merge...**

Last week the combined Parish Pastoral Councils met again. There many things we need to continue to look at as we move toward the merging of our parishes by the end of May next year.

**A New Name** - Since the process of the merger involves the two parishes becoming one entity, we will need to have a new name. The parishes of Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of the Lake will no longer exist as separate corporate bodies; instead we will become one, new parish. *We will still have two worship sites; there will be no immediate change with regards to physical space.* Yet, we will need a new name. The bishop of a diocese is the only one who can choose a name for a parish. However, Bishop Kinney often asks parishioners to help pick a name. As such, we will introduce a process next month inviting all members of both parishes to be involved in the selection of a new name. Stay tuned.

**The Changes in the Mass are coming in Advent.  
A New Missal Study Resource to help us.**

The changes at Mass with the new translation of the Roman Missal begin on the First Sunday of Advent. Small study groups are now forming at both parish sites for those who wish to look more closely at these changes. We will use *Lifting Up Our Hearts* as a resource for participants to engage in a six-session small group faith-sharing process to renew our appreciation of the liturgy. Through reflection on the changes to the people's parts of the Mass, we will come to a deeper understanding of the role of the assembly at Mass

**Preparing for the New Translation of the Mass  
On November 27, 2011 - 1st Sunday of Advent  
This week we explore 'The Liturgy of the Word'**

We know from the Gospels that Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience God's presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself, and we recognize the story of God acting in the past and in our own lives as well. The homily is to help us to see these connections more clearly. Then through the Profession of Faith (Creed) and the Prayer of the Faithful (General Intercessions), our response to the readings prepare us to enter into the Eucharistic Prayer which follows.
